

# Paper Presentation Guidelines

## Introduction

For each paper that we will read in class, one student will be assigned as the discussion lead to both present some of the main findings in the course and lead the class in discussion. This presentation will count towards 25% of your overall grade.

This document will discuss the expectations for the creation of the course presentation and discussion elements.

## Requirements

When it is your turn to lead the discussion on the paper, you must do the following:

- Read the paper in depth and any relevant related work cited in the main paper
- Design a presentation to provide to the class that details the high-level takeaways and paper findings (5-minutes) and guides discussion
- Send Deepak the presentation and discussion questions at least 3 days in advance and incorporate his feedback before presenting

## Presentation Details

Your presentation must include the following components:

- A 5-minute introduction which describes the main ideas in the paper, their methods, and their main findings
- 10-discussion questions that are designed to probe, stimulate, or provoke the class. These questions should situate themselves in the context of the broader work in the area, and ideally be in conversation with bigger ideas in the class.

The presentation must be sent to Deepak 72 hours in advance of the presentation. He will provide feedback at least 24 hours before the presentation that you must incorporate before you give the talk. Mostly, his feedback will be on the structuring / ordering of the questions, and potentially asking for more context or a deeper version of each question.

Your grade will be determined by the timeliness of your submission of the presentation, the clarity of your presentation, and your incorporation of Deepak's feedback.
